

### *Father's Day Cookie Recipe*

Celebrate all things Dad with this delectable big cookie! A perfect way for the whole family to get involved in making memories and creating that special treat for Dad on his special day!

#### **Ingredients:**

- ◆ 1 package (16.5 ounces) NESTLÉ® TOLL HOUSE® Refrigerated Chocolate Chip Cookie Bar Dough
- ◆ 1 cup of ready-to-use frosting
- ◆ Decorator sugar and sprinkles (optional)

#### **Instructions:**

- ⇒ Preheat oven to 325 degrees. Grease 10-12 inch pizza pan or baking sheet
- ⇒ Place whole bar of dough on prepared pan. Allow to soften for 5 to 10 minutes. Using fingertips, pat dough gently to form 8 inch circle.
- ⇒ Bake 18 to 20 minutes or until golden brown. Cool on baking sheet for 10 minutes; remove to wire rack to cool.
- ⇒ Decorate with icing, sugar and sprinkles as desired.
